This undertaking is significant in terms of both labor and financial, and the borough is working with state and federal officials in pursuit of grant money that may cover up to half the cost. We hope to begin work on the replacement facility later this year with the intent of having it ready for use in 2020.

The Borough is running another great line-up of concerts in the Univest Performance Center in the Park at 4th Street this summer. Tickets can be purchased at Quakertownevents.com and more information can be found on the borough website. The concerts were a great success in 2018 and we're working to make the 2019 season even better. Please try to join the fun at one or more performances this year. The free Sunday concert season also begins in July and runs through August.

Enjoy the summer season and all that Quakertown has to offer!

The Quakertown Borough Police Department is devoted to our relationship with residents and business owners. We are committed to protecting our community in every possible manner. One way to make our community more secure is through the use of surveillance cameras. Video surveillance is one of the best methods for the apprehension and conviction of offenders. The Quakertown Borough Police Department has utilized this technology in numerous cases to successfully prosecute criminals. We have created a Security Camera



Index to allow residents and business owners to register their current camera systems in our database. Installing video surveillance is a great example of community-police partnerships and is something we highly value as a police agency serving our community. Residents and business owners are providing the police department with the locations and abilities of their protective systems. By registering with us, we can quickly identify nearby cameras that may have captured criminal activity. After registering your camera, police personnel may request to view your camera footage to assist in an investigation regarding a crime that occurred in that area. You are under no obligation to give police video if you do not wish to. Information provided to the Quakertown Borough Police Department regarding your camera systems will be for official use only, and personal information will be kept confidential. Quakertown Borough Police Department K9 Fury Retires, Welcomes New K9 Ranger

Late this May, the Quakertown Police K9 Unit was sad to announce the retirement of K9 officer, Fury due to several dental fractures. Back in February of this year, during a regular teeth cleaning at the Quakertown Vet, they discovered 6 of Fury's teeth were at risk of absessing due to being fractured or worn down. Four of these teeth were his canine teeth. If not corrected it could potentially cause a lot of pain or further damage. After several visits to some of the best veterinarians in the area, they concluded that the best way for Fury to live a happy and pain-free life would be to retire.

In order to find Fury a new home, the Police Department K9 Unit teamed up with Project K9 Hero, a nonprofit organization that assists in covering the cost associated with retired dogs. With the vision to ensure the best quality of life for our nation's retired Military Working Dogs and Police K9, they knew an immediate potential adopter. Kyle Kowalski, a U.S Army Ranger Canine Handler and combat Veteran would become Fury's new owner and perfect match after recently losing his partner, Spike to Canine Lymphoma after serving 3 tours of Afghanistan together.

Fury is now living with Kyle and his family on a farm in Wisconsin on thousands of acres. During Fury's retirement he will be doing what he loves most: running and chewing on his favorite Kong Toys. Kyle feels extremely blessed to have the opportunity to provide a safe home and environment for Fury as well as a partner in life. We know Fury is going to enjoy retirement and his new family.

In late May after Furys retirement, the Police K9 Unit selected their new K9, Ranger. The two-year-old German Shepard was named to recognize Fury's new owner, Kyle a retired Army Ranger Vet. Ranger has already completed basic training at Tar Heel K9 in North Carolina and will continue his obedience training along with specialized training to detect specific substances and other trainings associated with patrol work. In September, Officer Tyler Fahringer will be joining Ranger to finish their training together. After graduation, we look forward to seeing Ranger on duty in October.





Hydrant Flushing



Flushing will be done Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Each year the Quakertown Water Department opens fire hydrants throughout the Borough and the neighboring service areas, allowing water to flow through the pipes. As a result of flushing you may experience reduced water pressure and/or discolored water. If discoloration occurs, run cold water until clear. If you have any questions please call the Quakertown Water Department at 215-536-5855.

Garage/Yard Sale Permits

It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct a garage sale in the Borough without first filing with the Zoning Officer the information required and obtaining from the Zoning Officer a permit to do so.


A permit to conduct a garage sale shall be issued for any one residential property or to any one household no more than two times within a calendar year, and no such permit shall be issued for more than three consecutive calendar days.

Each permit issued under this Part must be prominently displayed on the premises and be visible from the street upon which the garage sale is conducted throughout the entire period of the permitted sale. The permit for a garage sale shall not be transferable.

No signs advertising the garage sale are to be posted on any place other than the premises of the applicant. The sign is not to exceed two feet by two feet in size, cannot be placed on the premises earlier than one week prior to the sale and must be removed within 24 hours after the sale has terminated. Directional signs only may be placed on private property with the owner's permission.

You can access a permit application by either calling the Borough Code Enforcement Office or by going to the Borough's web site at www.quakertown.org. An approved permit will be issued with a copy of the ordinance pertaining to garage sales.









COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT



Lithium ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, scooters, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. Take care when using them. In rare cases, they can cause a fire or explosion.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed or on a couch.
- Keep batteries at room temperature.
- Do not place batteries in direct sunlight or keep them in hot vehicles.
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice the problems.

- odor
- change in color
- too much heat
- change in shape
- leaking
- odd noises

If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call **9-1-1**.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.
- Lithium ion batteries should be placed in a sealed metal container.

Energy Conservation

Conserving energy at home is a great idea for many reasons. It cuts down on energy costs, and because most of the energy we use comes from fossil fuels, using less is beneficial for the environment, too.

In many ways, saving energy can be pretty simple. You can find dozens of different ways to conserve — such as turning down your thermostat in the winter, putting a blanket on your water heater or switching to more efficient light bulbs. But most homes are so inefficient that even after you've done all the easy home improvements, there are still dozens of ways to save money and energy. How do you identify them all and then decide which to do first?



Unfortunately, the improvements that save you the most energy over time tend to be expensive. Before you spend hundreds — or even thousands — of dollars on home improvements, such as buying a new furnace, installing insulation or putting in new windows, it's nice to know how much energy they'll actually save. Just as important, you'll want to know how long these home energy upgrades will take to pay for themselves and start saving you money.

These questions aren't just for older homes — new homes often have significant energy problems, as well.

"New houses typically aren't as solidly constructed as older houses. New homes can leak more air, causing health and comfort problems, and the quality of the wood and other building components can be poor. Insulation is often very sloppily installed and, in many cases, missing entirely.



A home energy audit can help. Most homeowners aren't knowledgeable about how to look for these problems, nor how to properly correct them. Unless your home is an Energy Star home or has undergone energy testing, you will likely experience high energy bills and comfort problems, so it is well worth having an energy audit performed.
