Project Lifesaver

The Quakertown Borough Police Department is proud to offer the Project Lifesaver program! Project Lifesaver is the premier search and rescue program operated internationally by public safety agencies and is strategically designed for "at risk" individuals who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. The primary mission of Project Lifesaver is to provide timely response to save lives and reduce potential injury for adults and children with the propensity to wander due to a cognitive condition. Project Lifesaver is a community based, public safety, non-profit organization that provides law enforcement, and caregivers with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to wandering. The necessity of this program was determined through the correlation between cognitive conditions and the act of wandering. With the dramatic increase of cognitive conditions since the inception of the organization, the program has grown from a localized program to a program recognized internationally as a proven and effective method of "bringing loved one's home."

Project Lifesaver was the first to apply such locating techniques to aid in the search and rescue of individuals and is the most widely used and proven most effective program in the nation that is specifically designed to protect the "At Risk" populations in our communities. The program was structured in a way that strategically combined state of the art locating technologies, innovative search and rescue methods, and community policing courses that educated first responders about cognitive conditions. The search times for certified Project Lifesaver agencies have been reduced from hours, potentially days, down to minutes. Recovery times for Project Lifesaver agencies average 30 minutes, which is 95% less time than standard operations without Project Lifesaver. The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies their local Project Lifesaver agency, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized frequency to locate the position of the individual. The knowledge given from the community policing courses is best applied in this situation because the first responders will know how to best approach the client once found, and allow them to be brought back to safety.



The Quakertown Borough Police Department is devoted to our relationship with residents and business owners. We are committed to protecting our community in every possible manner. One way to make our community more secure is through the use of surveillance cameras. Video surveillance is one of the best methods for the apprehension and conviction of offenders. The Quakertown Borough Police Department has utilized this technology in numerous cases to

successfully prosecute criminals. We have created a Security Camera Index to allow residents and business owners to register their current camera systems in our database. Installing video surveillance is a great example of community-police partnerships and is something we highly value as a police agency serving our community. Residents and business owners are providing the police department with the locations and abilities of their protective systems. By registering with us, we can quickly identify nearby cameras that may have captured criminal activity. After registering your camera, police personnel may request to view your camera footage to assist in an investigation regarding a crime that occurred in that area. You are under no obligation to give police video if you do not wish to. Information provided to the Quakertown Borough Police Department regarding your camera systems will be for official use only, and personal information will be kept confidential. 





Tree Tenders and Earth Day

On April 22nd, 2022, Quakertown Borough Tree Tenders and Quakertown Borough Staff were joined by United Friends School's (UFS) second and third grade classrooms to plant fifteen trees at Memorial Park around QuiNBy's Playground. These fifteen trees will mature to shade trees to provide natural shade for visitors of QuiNBy's Playground. There were four Red Maple, three Hackberry, four Honey Locust, and four London Plane trees planted. At the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, UFS second and third grade classrooms started weekly visits to Licking Run Creek, where they are taught by their UFS teachers and Bucks County Penn State Extension Watershed Stewards. Students were gathering data to measure the health of Licking Run Creek. They plan to post their findings on citizen science sites that crowdsource vital information about our local watershed. Additionally, students have been learning effective ways to help protect Licking Run Creek, such as planting more trees within Memorial Park to aid in reducing stormwater runoff. To get these fifteen trees planted within Memorial Park the students wrote persuasive letters to Quakertown Borough and raised over \$700 for a tree planting!

Quakertown Borough Tree Tenders was established in Spring 2022. Tree Tenders is a program that was established through the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society (PHS). PHS's Tree Tenders program works with volunteer-based community groups to plant trees. The program provides workshops on tree planting, care, and volunteer organization. Quakertown Borough Tree Tenders was one of eighty tree tenders' groups across the Greater Philadelphia Region to plant trees this Spring. In total 1,500+ trees were planted between all eighty tree tenders' groups!

Garage/Yard Sale Permits

It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct a garage sale in the Borough without first filing with the Zoning Officer the information required and obtaining from the Zoning Officer a permit to do so.

A permit to conduct a garage sale shall be issued for any one residential property or to any one household no more than two times within a calendar year, and no such permit shall be issued for more than three consecutive calendar days.

Each permit issued under this Part must be prominently displayed on the premises and be visible from the street upon which the garage sale is conducted throughout the entire period of the permitted sale. The permit for a garage sale shall not be transferable.

No signs advertising the garage sale are to be posted on any place other than the premises of the applicant. The sign is not to exceed two feet by two feet in size, cannot be placed on the premises earlier than one week prior to the sale and must be removed within 24 hours after the sale has terminated. Directional signs only may be placed on private property with the owner's permission.

Moody's Investors Services Releases Credit Opinion

On April 19, Moody's Investors Service (Moody's) released a credit opinion regarding the recent updates to the credit analysis of Quakertown Borough A1 rating. According to the Moody's opinion, "Quakertown Borough is a relatively small suburban tax base with below-average but stable resident wealth. The Borough's General Fund reserves are fairly narrow and largely supported by Enterprise Funds rather than tax revenues." However, the Moody's opinion confirms that Quakertown Borough, exhibits "Solid management controls and long-term planning".

The report recognizes specific credit challenges such as "General Fund is reliant upon transfers from Enterprise Funds to balance operations" and "Small tax base with below-average resident wealth indicators". Conversely, the report also asserts the credit strength as "Significant reserves outside the General Fund which are readily available to support operations".

The opinion from Moody's is conclusive evidence of Quakertown Borough's economic strength and sound fiscal policies, particularly during these extraordinary times.

Infrastructure 101

Infrastructure - What is it, what does it mean? The infrastructure in the Borough consists of the roads, water system, sewer system, electrical system, etc. Our lives as we know them depend on a reliable, well maintained infrastructure to support our needs as a Borough and in the big picture, our nation.

The Borough's water system and associated infrastructure was originally developed in the late 1800's. In the beginning, the Borough did not own the system; it was privately owned and went by the name of the Quakertown Water Company. In the 1940's it was sold and became the Quakertown Water Authority, and a short time later became municipally owned by the Borough and continues as such to this day.

As our Borough grew, the water system was expanded to accommodate growth adding additional water wells and water mains to meet the increased demand. As the years progressed it became apparent that the water system needed some upgrading, so in the 1960's a large portion of the water mains, (approximately 30-35%), were replaced to provide better supply and firefighting capability.

In the 1970's, the Federal Government passed the Safe Drinking Water Act. As the Act was expanded and the regulations became more stringent, the Borough began a program in the mid 1980's to upgrade the water quality and water main replacements. This work continues even now. Periodically you will see the Water Department personnel working in the Borough replacing a water main or digging up and repairing leaks. Additionally, work is constantly being done to the wells and equipment that supply these water mains. This work mainly goes unnoticed because the wells and treatment facilities are scattered in and around the Borough. All of this is what makes up the water system infrastructure.

The Borough has spent millions of dollars over the years to upgrade and improve our water system. It is a never-ending process to keep pace with the systems' needs. With proper planning and funding, work will continue to be done to improve the Borough's water infrastructure well into the future.

BEHIND THE METER

Behind The Meter – Peak Shaving Generation Project

Over the past year, the Borough of Quakertown has been in discussions with American Municipal Power, Inc. (AMP) regarding a generation project which is now a reality. This project not only provides peak shaving, demand response, lower capacity and demand charges, but also provides a "back-up" system to our electric grid in the event of a catastrophic event.

In late April, Energy Infrastructure Solutions, LLC prepped the site for the 10.8 meg generation system that is now installed at our sub-station. Once the project is complete, American Municipal Power is responsible for managing



the generation to impact the coincident peaks throughout the year and reduce the peak energy demand and lower the capacity cost, impacting the cost of energy to the Borough.




